#### **Position:**

Assistant Professor of Health and Human Performance

The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga (UTC) invites applications and nominations for a tenure track faculty position at the Assistant Professor level. The successful applicant will show evidence of an ability to teach courses in the Undergraduate and Graduate Exercise Science program with specific training in either health psychology/behavioral science dealing with chronic health challenges such as obesity, drug/alcohol, smoking, physical activity and sedentary behaviors. Candidates must have a working knowledge of ACSM standards in their respective specialization. Candidate would be expected to collaborate and engage in the community and develop a research agenda and seek grant opportunities in their respective fields. Preference will be given to candidates holding ACSM, NSCA or National Strength and Conditioning certification.

#### **Qualifications:**

Earned Doctorate in exercise science, exercise physiology, health psychology, public health and/or related field. Preference will be given to candidates with evidence of teaching, research and external grant support in some of the following areas: Exercise Leadership, Personal Training, Health Behavior Change, Exercise Programing at the clinical and/or community level as well as core courses in Exercise Physiology and Kinesiology. The ideal candidate will promote active living by leading a healthy and active lifestyle.
